A STRIKING piece of bushfire-inspired artwork, which has made its way across the state, has returned to the Latrobe Valley.

'Firewall' was created by Gippsland expressionist artist Kerrie Warren who used painting as an outlet to help her cope with the trauma of the Black Saturday bushfires, which threatened her Crossover home and art
