Local artists create diversity

A diverse group of six professional artists from the Bow-Bow Shire have recently come together to create a contemporary body of work entitled and based on the theme "Gippsland".

"Gippsland" will be launched at the West Gippsland Arts Centre in Warragul on August 8 before touring regional Victoria, Melbourne and Wangaratta's sister city, Ju Jang in China in a cultural exchange.

The artists, as part of the group "Wild Dogs from Down Under" are Kerrie Warren, Louise Scott, Linda Gholson, Cheryle Miles, Irene Moxon-Jones and Laura Collins.

This exhibition of works aims to inspire and stimulate with other cultures and "connection" and groups of people from various backgrounds by coming together and working toward a common goal - tell a story and create a "whole picture" through a variety of perspectives.

The artwork will be new, original, vibrant and contemporary visual art in the genres of Indigenous and Non-Indigenous oil and acrylic painting, mixed

media and fine-divisional photography.

Through this work, the artists will express the diversity of and their love for their home of Gippsland - environmental and social issues, landscape, time and place - and how they see themselves within it.

One of the artists, Kerrie Warren of Cranbourne, has explored and examined the Gippsland coastline from a coastal perspective for her ongoing art exhibition "Gippsland".

"Our theme 'Gippsland' was chosen because this is our home, our place," said Kerrie. "Each Wild Dog artist feels very passionate about the landscape that surrounds and embodies them. We are all very fortunate to live in such a beautiful environment and, through art, we can express our vision or appreciate the beauty also - maybe other people will interpret it differently and hopefully remember to look about."

Kerrie's artwork for the exhibition is contemporary, expressive, emotional, dramatic and impressionistic. She has studied in the coast for another half of her life using red ochre and, rock-like, compound, translucent and opaque acrylic paints to create a "bit of

art, she then laid the can down on the floor to create moving water through the lines and dots with swirling movement.

Kerrie created the human populated areas by placing rows of additional square shaped circles and points - indicating ownership of property, man-made boundaries and electric lights. Greenish, more organic areas indicate the less populated areas which include natural parks and bushland.

"When I look at a map of Gippsland, the coastline stands out to me - the unique shape, the edge that divides the earth from the water - and it truly moves me," said Kerrie.

"Through my art I express to others how I feel about the subject matter."

Kerrie said she enjoys working spontaneously to express the energy of the sea for the first-starting and starting within the landscape and the people that surround her. She sees it as a physical, mental and emotional process where passion and intuition are predominant.

"I hope that when other people view my work, they will stop and think and wonder about the environment and landscape and remember how precious it is," said Kerrie.

Kerrie holds a Diploma of Art - Ceramics and Diploma of Therapeutic Art Therapy. She has been busy with exhibitions and other work since helping to organise an exhibition "Through My Eyes" at the West Gippsland Arts Centre in

2004. She also won the prestigious held exhibition at the Regional Art Show in 2004.

Jack will be an artist from Down Under "Gippsland" touring exhibition will be featured on the paper and the exhibition's book.
