# Wild Dogs set to innovate and inspire

Images of Gippsland will be brought to life in an interactive and exciting travelling art exhibition inspired by six local artists now known as "Wild Dogs from Down Under".

The diversity of Gippsland will be represented through diverse art mediums in an exhibition that will take on the world.

While an international exhibition is underway a remote cluster of restaurants, this group will not only be making it a reality, but presenting their initial art show here.

"Wild Dogs from Down Under" is an idea born by Crosswater artist Kerrie Warren. She, she said, the concept did not take much developing.

"This other artist was quick to jump on board, recognising the wonderful opportunity that they shared in exhibitions that will appropriately be launched in Warragul before travelling around regional Victoria, to Melbourne, Warragul's sister city, Jakarta, China and later on to Los Angeles.

The artists include Kerrie, Eliza Harrison of Warragul, Gary Miles of Great West, Jenny Macneil-Jones of Warragul, Leanne Ryan of Milmerran and Lauren Collier of Hill End.

"We all come from such different backgrounds, Gippsland is so diverse it will so we are presenting Gippsland in its true light because we are diverse."

"We are making it in Gippsland so that when we travel we will create an atmosphere of Gippsland so that people visiting the exhibition will feel they have been to Gippsland.

"We are also creating a Gippsland landscape as that background motif will be words of Gippsland."

"In many ways the making of this project will

mark another happening in our success as artists," she said.

Kerrie had a travelling exhibition was presenting the last being focusing about the geography of Victoria and was finally done a couple of months ago and will be in other states.

Kerrie said these six emerging professional artists would work together to create the works. Each artist will feature five pieces in the exhibition.

"The artwork will be contemporary, conceptual and contemporary visual art in the genres of sculpture and non-traditional painting, mixed sculpture and three-dimensional photography based on Gippsland," she said.

Kerrie said the artists would explore and develop their own unique styles and applications to create a strong and varied body of contemporary visual art that will have to present in the wider community.

The works will be presented and created during the first seven months of 2008 with the aim of launching the exhibition

in Warragul later in the year.

It is planned the exhibition will tour regional Victoria in the first half of 2007 and then the international stage later that year.

She said they hoped to establish an art and cultural exchange with artists in visiting who could be invited to come and stay with local artists and put their works in an exhibition at the West Gippsland Arts Centre.

Kerrie said the artists and project manager Ben Bowdler and marketing officer Michael Hogan will be present at the exhibition openings where creative and the artists will make themselves available to speak about their work.

The diversity of the artists and the works they will produce can be seen in what they say about themselves.

Kerrie's work is abstract, conceptual and experimental - it is a collection of my unconscious creation, a spontaneous release of creative energies. It is a look to my own existence within my environment.

"When I work to create a native sense, I am up camp in remote parts of the outback for weeks at a time to fully understand my nation."
